Theatre Workshop: The most social of the arts

Session I, June 29—July 10: Actors' workshop will explore the foundations of the art of acting. Beginning with the actor's greatest tool—the imagination—participants will immerse themselves in the craft of acting. From improvisation to simple scene and monologue work, actors will gain an understanding of how to use the important physical tools of the voice and body. Actors will use masks to explore different characters, as well as participate in two classes in stage fight and choreography. Musical theater will also be explored. Camp will culminate in a recital showcasing what the students have created in the session. Open to students entering 5th-8th grade.

Session II, July 13—July 24: Actor's Workshop This is a performance-based class, and actors will be working on scenes and monologues. Together, we will explore classical and contemporary material chosen specifically for each student. Sessions will start with a group exercise and a mini class on a specific tool of the actor's craft including voice, movement and period style. Actors will also participate in stage-fight choreography and musical theater. There will be a recital at the end of the session. Open to students entering 9th-12th grade.

Campers will be ably directed by Carol Kehoe, a member of Actor's Equity and has worked professionally in the theater as an Actor, Director, Producer and Teacher for over 25 years. She has taught adults and children of all levels, as well as coached actors for theater, film and television. Her stage credits cover a wide range. Over 50 leading roles in professional theater include most of Shakespeare's fascinating women and several east coast premiers, four of which won Performance of the Year awards from the Newark Star Ledger.
