Come learn basic skills and techniques necessary to create simple woodworking projects using hand tools. Children will be shown how to use a variety of woodworking tools effectively and safely. Keyboarding Skills

Thursdays

3:15-4:15

Many children use a computer nowadays, but work with the hunt and peck approach. In this class, students will learn to use all of their fingers to type without looking at the keyboard, while maintaining appropriate posture and position. Their typing speed and accuracy are likely to improve when they learn the keyboard format and practice using the finger positions. Using the appropriate keyboarding techniques enables students to type comfortably for an extended timeframe without fatigue or risk of repetitive motion injury.

Each student will be working on a small keyboard that the school owns. Mrs. Wasem will provide step by step instruction so students learn proper typing skills. Students are expected to practice at home between classes, working at their own pace.

From Downtown Princeton: From 206, take Elm Road to the stop light. Turn right on to Cherry Valley Road. Approximately 1 mile, turn left on to Cherry Hill Road. The campus is one mile to the left.

From Northern Princeton: From 206, take Cherry Hill Road until the road "ends" and intersects with Cherry Valley Road. Make a left and a quick right. You are still on Cherry Hill Road. The campus is one mile on the left.
